

SUMMER 2018: Required Reading List – Grade 12

All students must choose **two** books to read over the summer. One book *must* come from the teacher generated list, but the other can come from the Other section.

The two selected books must be at or above the student's reading level and students should not have read their selections before. All students will be assessed on their summer reading in the first days of the 2018-2019 school year. **Academic Decathlon students may read *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead* by Tom Stoppard in lieu of a selection from the teacher generated list. AP Literature students should read one of the 12th grade required books in addition to their assigned books; AP Language students should read the books specific to their course.**

Note: It is encouraged that parents participate in the selection of texts to ensure that students are reading appropriate material, both thematically and academically.
